

In the Belton MS Band, we form a partnership between teacher and student where *both* share responsibility in their musical development. Our team of teachers include middle school directors, private lesson instructors, high school directors, and even hired clinicians, masterclass teachers, and adjudicators. We





also strive to communicate and produce strong partnerships with parents since their support is vital in their student's growth.

To that end, we as the teaching team provide Introduction, Comprehension, and Demonstration to students for their instruction. However, <u>each student has a responsibility as well to facilitate</u>

<u>Repetition in the form of practicing daily for at least 25 minutes, 5 days per week.</u>

This means that <u>instruments go home everyday</u> to practice the concepts, patterns, and music that we go over daily in class. This leads to student Mastery of their music and ultimately of their instrument. <u>Students have homework everyday in Band</u> as they practice their instrument in preparation for performances and to continue their musical growth. Beginner's Ensemble

First Band Concert - THIS THURSDAY!

Your student's first sit-in concert is coming up **this Thursday** in the BMS Cafeteria! Students should arrive by 6:15pm already dressed in their Band Uniform, which consists of their band shirt <u>tucked into</u> <u>jeans</u> with closed-toed shoes - young gentlemen should also wear a belt. Due to a volleyball game happening at the same time, please use entrance H-7 to enter the Cafeteria to avoid having to buy a ticket (see map below).



A "sit-in" concert is where students sit alongside their parents and families rather than on a stage. We want to make their first performance as stress-free as possible!

- Woodwinds will bring their case to the Cafeteria and assemble their instruments there
- Brass will assemble their instrument in the Band Hall and leave their case in their band locker
- Percussion students will set up and perform in the main Band Hall with their families

All students should be <u>seated ready to go by 6:25pm</u>, and the concert will start promptly at 6:30pm. As for all performances, here is the grading rubric the directors will use to determine your child's grade for the performance:

- Be Punctual Students need to be in their spots ready to perform no later than 6:25pm (25%)
- <u>Be Prepared</u> Students should have all of their supplies and materials, including their binder and music along with their well-maintained instrument (25%)
- <u>Be Prepared</u> When they arrive at school by 6:15pm, students should already have on their band uniform, which is their band shirt tucked into jeans with closed-toed shoes (gentlemen should wear a belt 25%)
- <u>Be Disciplined</u> Students should always be on their best behavior and set the example for proper concert etiquette, which includes remaining silent while someone is playing or speaking, remaining seated throughout the performance, and applauding appropriately (25%)

As you can see, students have the potential to do very well for this major grade! If students are Punctual, Prepared, Disciplined, and Relentless, they will automatically Be Superior. These Five Guidelines of Success dictate all of our procedures and philosophy of the Belton MS Band. We are very excited for this first performance of the 2025-2026 Beginner's Ensemble! 

Students 1-5 minutes late will have their sectional grade reduced to an 85. Students who are late 5-15 minutes will have their grade reduced to a 70. Students arriving more than 15 minutes late will receive a 50.
