Teacher & Student Shared Responsibilities

In the Belton MS Band, we form a partnership between teacher and student where *both* share responsibility in their musical development. Our team of teachers include middle school directors, private lesson instructors, high school directors, and even hired clinicians, masterclass teachers, and adjudicators. We also strive to communicate and produce strong partnerships with parents since their support is vital in their student's growth.


To that end, we as the teaching team provide Introduction, Comprehension, and Demonstration to students for their instruction. However, each student has a responsibility as well to facilitate Repetition in the form of practicing daily for at least 25 minutes, 5 days per week.

This means that **instruments go home everyday** to practice the concepts, patterns, and music that we go over daily in class. This leads to student Mastery of their music and ultimately of their instrument. Students have homework everyday in Band as they practice their instrument in preparation for performances and to continue their musical growth. Reach out to a director if you would like more information on how to better help and support the musical growth of your student.

Instruments Come Home Daily!

Students should take their instruments home daily and we expect them to practice 5 days a week for at least 25 minutes. Students may also practice before school in the Band Hall starting at 7:30am every school day.

Parents, we implore you to help set up a consistent practice routine at home for your student. Students will not improve their musical skills on their instrument without practice outside of regular class time. The directors, we will teach your student *what* and *how* to practice, but we need your help in establishing *when* and *how much* they practice. Elementary Recruiting Tour





Beginner Solo Contest - Saturday, February 21

Beginners will have their next performance on Saturday, February 21 anytime from 9am-12pm at BMS. Students will prepare a solo to be performed one-on-one for a judge who is a professional musician on their instrument who will give them comments, critique, and a rating. Students must be academically eligible to attend this event.

If they are not, they will perform their solo for a director earlier in the week at school. These students will be told privately with individual parent notification.



Students will need to arrive 10 minutes before their performance time in order to warm-up before proceeding to their room to perform. After performing in their time slot for around 5 minutes, students are then free to leave and can look up their rating afterwards on a shared Google Doc.






