Teacher & Student Shared Responsibilities

In the Belton MS Band, we form a partnership between teacher and student where *both* share responsibility in their musical development. Our team of teachers include middle school directors, private lesson instructors, high school directors, and even hired clinicians, masterclass teachers, and adjudicators. We also strive to communicate and produce strong partnerships with parents since their support is vital in their student's growth.

To that end, we as the teaching team provide Introduction, Comprehension, and Demonstration to students for their instruction. However, each student has a responsibility as well to facilitate Repetition in the form of practicing daily for at least 25 minutes, 5 days per week.

This means that **instruments go home everyday** to practice the concepts, patterns, and music that we go over daily in class. This leads to student Mastery of their music and ultimately of their

instrument. Students have homework everyday in Band as they practice their instrument in preparation for performances and to continue their musical growth. Reach out to a director if you would like more information on how to better help and support the musical growth of your student.

Instruments Come Home Daily!

Students should take their instruments home daily and we expect them to practice 5 days a week for at least 25 minutes. Students may also practice before school in the Band Hall starting at 7:30am every school day.

Students will not improve their musical skills on their instrument without practice outside of regular class time. The directors, we will teach your student *what* and *how* to practice, but we need your help in establishing *when* and *how much* they practice. Beginner's Ensemble

Beginner Solo Contest - Saturday, February 21

Beginners will have their next performance on Saturday, February 21 anytime from 9am-12pm at BMS. Students will prepare a solo to be performed one-on-one for a judge who is a professional

musician on their instrument who will give them comments, critique, and a rating. Students must be academically eligible to attend this event. If they are not, they will perform their solo for a director earlier in the week at school. These students will be told privately with individual parent notification.



Students will need to arrive 10 minutes before their performance time in order to warm-up before proceeding to their room to perform. After performing in their time slot for around 5 minutes, students are then free to leave and can look up their rating afterwards on a shared Google Doc.







All-Region Jazz Results


Over 200 middle school band students from all across Central Texas competed in the TMEA All-Region Jazz Auditions. Only 42 were selected from a blind judging process and are considered the top jazz musicians in the area. Belton ISD placed a total of 17 students in the All-Region Jazz Band, which is over 40% of both jazz ensembles from area schools, and the most from any school district!

Belton MS had 6 students make this prestigious ensemble and we want to recognize these superior musicians:

- **Nicolas Dieter** placed 7th out of 40 trumpets, earning 2nd Chair in Jazz Ensemble 2
- **Ethan Velez** placed 9th in the trumpets, earning 4th Chair in Jazz Ensemble 2. He is also an All-Region Concert Band member
- **Liam Henderson** placed 3rd out of 52 trombones, earning 3rd Chair in Jazz Ensemble 1. He is also an All-Region Concert Band member
- **Preston Kirkpatrick** placed 2nd out of 10 drummers, earning 2nd Chair in Jazz Ensemble 1
- **William Phipps** placed 3rd in the drum section, earning 1st Chair in Jazz Ensemble 2. He is also an All-Region Concert Band member
- **Jadyn Jones** placed 1st in the vibraphone section, earning 1st Chair in Jazz Ensemble 1 for the second year in a row. She is a 2-Year All-Region Jazz Band Member AND an All-Region Concert Band Member

As an honorable mention, **Ava Smith** placed 12th out of 40 trumpets, and serves as the 2nd Alternate. She is also an All-Region Concert Band Member.
